2022 Student Scholarship

The San Diego Chapter of the Association of Environmental Professionals (AEP) supports students who are actively engaged in the pursuit of a career in a field with an environmental emphasis. As part of San Diego AEP's support efforts, this scholarship is focused on supporting high school juniors and seniors interested in pursuing an education in environmentally related topics and will be given to Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) recipients. This scholarship is a specific action San Diego AEP is taking to promote and encourage BIPOC voices within our profession.

The monetary award will be up to \$1,000 per scholarship recipient. Each scholarship recipient will also receive a complimentary admittance to one AEP-sponsored luncheon. These luncheons are a great opportunity to network with other students and local professionals in the environmental field, as well as learn about relevant and controversial topics associated with the San Diego region.

Scholarships will be awarded at the San Diego Chapter Annual Awards and Scholarship Benefit being held this Fall 2022. The scholarship recipients are expected to attend this event to receive their award, whether it be held virtually or in person.

HOW CAN THE MONEY BE USED?

The award can be used for educational pursuits including tuition, books, school supplies, research, etc. Recipients will receive a check in their name from the San Diego Chapter of AEP.

WHO CAN APPLY?

The San Diego Chapter of AEP will accept applications from incoming or current high school juniors or seniors with an emphasis on Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) students attending any high school in San Diego or Imperial County who are interested in pursuing a college/university education in environmentally related topics to support a future career in environmental work. Applicants must also have a minimum 3.0 GPA.

APPLICATIONS AND QUESTIONS

Students are required to complete the application form attached to this notice. In addition, current high school transcripts, and an essay are required.

Completed applications will be accepted electronically via email or document sharing platform (e.g., Dropbox, OneDrive, Google Drive, etc.) to the scholarship committee at sdaepstudentoutreach@gmail.com. To be eligible, complete applications must be postmarked by 5:00 p.m.
